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Women in Tech: DYPA and HUAWEI expand their cooperation on women's employment and reducing the digital divide

The "Women in Tech" programme will open up new employment prospects for the 500 women who will have the opportunity to upgrade their digital skills and enrich their CVs with knowledge that is sought after by companies in the Information and Communication Technology (ICT) sector. DYPA continues working with big tech companies to reduce the digital divide and meet the needs of businesses for appropriately skilled employees".
